Lesson Overview: In this lesson, students will learn vocabulary used in educational settings for use in their own classes, but also when visiting schools with their grandchildren or relatives for events, etc. Singular and plural forms of these words will be practiced, along with the appropriate form of the verb *Be*. Students will learn frequently used imperatives in these settings, such as *stand up*, *sit down*, *open your book*, etc. Listening for information, such as days of the week and time, will be practiced. Additionally, they will role-play making introductions of friends and family members. A trip to a local school will be offered as an extension activity.

Objectives:

- Students will recognize and say a limited number of words related to education.
- Students will be able to introduce a family member or friend.
- Students will become familiar with schools in their community.
- Students will follow imperatives given in slow and carefully articulated speech.
- Students will gain an awareness of American culture and customs
- Students will listen for and recognize information related to days of the week and time.
