Lesson Overview:

In this lesson, students will learn vocabulary needed for grocery shopping in their communities. Money skills will be practiced, along with understanding of store advertisements. Students will learn and recite frequently used phrases for this setting, such as *Excuse me, can you help me?* and *Where is/are the ...?* Additionally, they will become familiar with where different foods are located in a grocery store. Students will have the opportunity to tour a grocery store as an extension activity.

Objectives:

- Students will recognize and say a limited number of words related to grocery shopping.
- Students will be able to identify and name different coins and bills.
- Students will become familiar with where foods are located in a store.
- Students will learn and recite frequently used phrases in this setting, such as *Excuse me, can you help me?* and *Where is/are the ...?*
- Students will learn to understand store advertisements.
- Students will listen for and recognize key vocabulary in a grocery store ad.
